Regular updates and accessibility features contribute to its effectiveness in meeting the diverse needs of students and staff.

15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

All departments at Inderprastha Dental College and Hospital (IPDC) collaborate in educating and training the undergraduate and postgraduate students to provide comprehensive patient care and management. For the academic year, these departments organized interdisciplinary and add-on courses, featuring faculty members and selected Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) as resource persons. The Value added and Add on courses for the academic year 2022-23 encompass a spectrum of subjects, including fundamental sciences such as anatomy, dental photography, biopsy and magnification in dentistry. Additional advanced topics covered in the courses comprised fundamental implant courses, basic life support, and the material science of biodentin. The clinico-pathological conference takes place weekly, featuring presentations of special cases by postgraduate students. These cases are thoroughly discussed with

faculties from various departments, promoting a multidisciplinary approach. This platform encourages conversations about the diverse treatment approaches available. The institution consistently encounters patients who necessitate a multidisciplinary approach. Interdepartmental meetings convene regularly to deliberate on an integrated interdisciplinary line of treatment for special cases. In doing so, IPDC and its faculties are dedicated to delivering the optimal treatment for their patients. The institution is committed to fostering the overall character development of students. As part of this commitment, various value-added and skill development programs, such as Women's Day, Zero Discrimination, Human Rights Laws, and Medical Negligence, are regularly conducted. The institution places a strong emphasis on research and development, actively encouraging student involvement in research initiatives. Furthermore, the institute provides grants for specific noteworthy studies, and programs are conducted to teach scientific writing. IPDC aims to involve students in multidisciplinary learning approaches to facilitate their comprehensive development, ensuring that they acquire clinical and ethical skills in alignment with the National Education Policy 2020. IPDC endeavors to produce graduates and postgraduates equipped with the requisite skills to independently practice dentistry and contribute meaningfully to society.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

For Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education, our university must enrol with Academic Bank of Credits first. However, our institution has already introduced the 10-point grading system as advised by the University Grants Commission and DCI. The management committee of the college is aware of the need to prepare for implementation of National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) therefore the institution has registered in the National Academic Depository and is encouraging students to register themselves in Digi Lockers and start uploading their certificates. We are also working to sensitize all the students with the necessary knowledge for the preparedness. Meanwhile the institution provides various interdisciplinary and add-on courses to cater the individual interests of students and to provide flexibility in the curriculum.

17.Skill development:

Oral Medicine & Radiology: This department focuses on diagnosing and managing conditions affecting the oral and maxillofacial region. The students are trained in various radiographic techniques, and encouragement is given for attending subject-specific conferences and participating in camp and field visits.

Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery: The students in this department learn to diagnose, manage, and treat diseases, injuries, and defects of the head and neck region. They perform minor oral surgical procedures, observe major surgeries, and are involved in pre- and post-surgical management.

Periodontology & Implantology: This department provides comprehensive training in the diagnosis and treatment of periodontal diseases. The students gain technical and skill training in using high-end equipment and are academically prepared for teaching, research work, publications, and presentations.

Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics: This department offers preclinical simulating lab exposure for students, allowing them to work on patients. Clinical sections are equipped with state-of-the-art setups for patient management, and emphasis is placed on clinical knowledge, proper sterilization, and waste disposal protocols.

Prosthodontics and Crown & Bridge: The students in this department are trained to rehabilitate edentulous patients and manage maxillofacial facial defects and temporomandibular disorders. Training includes implantology and different implant systems.

Public Health Dentistry: The students learn to diagnose and provide treatment plans at individual and community levels. They plan and implement community oral health programs, conduct surveys, and impart oral health education.

Pediatric & Preventive Dentistry: This department focuses on recognizing developmental milestones, practicing caries risk assessment, managing children with early childhood caries, and performing preventive and interceptive orthodontic procedures.

Orthodontics & Dentofacial Orthopedics: This department covers basic knowledge of growth and development, patient record maintenance, diagnosis, and treatment planning. Students receive training in fixed mechanotherapy and appliance fabrication.

Oral Pathology & Microbiology: The students are trained to identify and histologically diagnose various pathological conditions associated with the head and neck region. They develop skills in routine histopathological evaluation and various research methodologies.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture,

using online course)

Undergraduate and Postgraduate students admitted to the institution come from diverse backgrounds across the country, adhering to NEET guidelines. They bring a rich mix of multicultural and linguistic diversity. The institution prides itself on fostering complete national integration and harmony. Following the guidelines of the affiliating university and DCI, the medium of instruction is English.

The teaching hospital attracts patients from various socio-economic and cultural strata, therefore students receive training in patient interaction to enhance their communication and soft skills. The institution fulfills its social responsibility through dental camps, school dental health education, and outreach programs in semi-urban and rural areas. Students are encouraged to communicate in their local language whenever needed.

A Gender Sensitization Program and initiatives addressing environmental issues sensitize students to social concerns within the Indian system. Awareness programs on the right to vote, yoga, diet, and lifestyle contribute to students' holistic development. In the realm of research, students are motivated to explore alternative remedies in the Indian system, such as herbal oral gels for oral ulcers, with potential applications in the prevention and treatment of oral diseases.

To further the holistic development, the institution organizes cultural programs, festivals, and events celebrating India annually, including Teachers' Day, Doctors Day, Women's Day, Oral Hygiene Day, Diwali, Christmas, Dussehra, Holi, and more.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The dental programs at IPDC prioritize equipping students with comprehensive knowledge and essential skills essential for daily practice. IPDC adopts an outcome-based education approach for both BDS and MDS curricula, giving equal weightage to clinical proficiency, research understanding, and leadership capabilities. Well-defined program outcomes and course outcomes contribute to fostering a diverse learning environment, fostering intellectual transformation among students.

IPDC is dedicated to maintaining the highest standards of excellence and professionalism, making research an integral component of patient-centered practice. The departments meticulously define and maintain program outcomes and course files for both BDS and MDS

programs.

Students undergo continuous evaluation, encompassing theoretical and practical assessments, vivas, and ongoing monitoring. The results are analyzed following a structured protocol, categorizing students as slow or advanced learners. Remedial classes and assignments are provided and mentor and mentee system is followed for slow learners, leading to noticeable academic improvements in subsequent evaluations. Additionally, participants in value-added and add-on programs are assessed using outcome-based feedback to gauge their understanding of the conducted programs.

20.Distance education/online education:

The institution firmly believes in the transformative impact of digitizing education to enhance the learning experience for students. In response to the pandemic, there was an imperative need to digitize teaching methods to ensure the continuity of the learning process. The faculty and students underwent training to proficiently operate digital platforms, and now the institution is fully equipped to conduct classes on platforms such as Zoom and Google Classroom for both undergraduate and postgraduate students.

In the web-based virtual environment, students have the flexibility to engage with academic lectures, which were traditionally conducted in physical classrooms. They can also conveniently store and review these lectures at their own pace. Additionally, educational videos available on the learning management system contribute to the development of clinical skills among dental students, laying a strong foundation for their future careers.

The institution's central library features an e-library, offering access to the latest articles from various reputable journals. This electronic resource is designed for remote access, allowing students to conveniently browse and retrieve information directly on their phones.

The institute also provides a digital subscription of EBSCO that helps students to easily access articles from latest journals. The institute also has facility to live demonstrate the cases from the surgical field to the students for a better learning experience.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning, delivery and evaluation through a well defined process as prescribed by the respective regulatory councils and the affiliating University.

The BDS & MDS Curriculum at Inderprastha Dental College & Hospital (IPDC) adheres to DCI guidelines. Formerly affiliated with Chaudhary Charan Singh University, IPDC is now under Atal Bihari Vajpayee University. The academic delivery aligns with the affiliating university's regulations.

While maintaining this alignment, IPDC distinguishes itself by offering valuable additions to enrich students' professional and personal lives. Regularly organized value-added courses, seminars(CPC), CDEs, and workshops, led by subject matter experts, contribute to this enrichment.

The Institution/Academic Committee formulates an academic calendar integrating lectures, labs, and clinical postings. The Principal and Heads of Departments collaborate on curriculum delivery methods, incorporating feedback from faculties, students, alumni & professionals. The recommendations are discussed, evaluated, and considered for implementation.

Evaluation follows University norms, with students facing three internal assessment exams annually. IPDC closely monitors student progress, conveying updates to parents. Remedial classes for identified slow learners aim to enhance their performance.

IPDC goes beyond standard curriculum offerings, arranging interdisciplinary courses, Clinico-pathological conferences, research projects, field visits, and training in advanced dental procedures.

The average footfall in hospital is 13016 per month which is significantly more than the minimum required as mandated by the DCI and appropriate for students to thoroughly learn the basic and certain advanced clinical dental procedures.

Separate rooms for Geriatric clinic, Implant clinics Tobacco Cessation Centre are also available.

The library is updated annually for books and journals based on the curriculum and annual budget, covering all dental specialties and basic medical sciences. Currently there are 2341 books, and 412 eBooks. The journals cover all dental and allied specialties constituting print journals 3596 (100 Titles) and e-journals (960) for article reference and learning. Also, learning in audio-visual media is present comprising of 153 CDs.

The library also is subscribed to discipline specific learning resource namely EBSCO for students access to journal articles, research reports, conference proceedings for thesis work and other projects It can be accessed through the institutional login and IP address only. It gives access to 412 dental e-books, and 960 dental e-journals

IPDC in association with gram panchayat of Raispur launched this mission with the objective of generating awareness of oral health among the villagers and motivate them to seek dental treatment in their vicinity. IPDC has established a clinic in Raispur, for people to access dental treatment. IPDC provides free transportation to patients requiring advance treatment. This practise was initiated in February 2022 and still continues till date for the benefit of people of Raispur.

BEST PRACTICE-2 Quit Tobacco- A Mission of IPDC

IPDC has been conducting Industrial Camps for years and observed that the industrial workers were committed to tobacco use, thus IPDC committed itself to get these workers quit the habit.

Hence, industries are identified, where all workers are screened and tobacco users are identified. Thereafter, tobacco cessation habit counselling is done. In year 2022 IPDC signed MOU with P ENT labels and Holyfaith industries where with IPDC efforts 61 % and 50 % Tobacco users quit the use of tobacco.

In year 2023 MOU were signed between Ahluwalia Contracts India Ltd. and Jain Enterprises. All the Tobacco users identified and regular follow up is being conducted

Digital dentistry - 3D Scanner and 3DPrinter

Inderprastha Dental College & Hospital (IPDC) believes in continuously upgrading the exposure of student to new technologies being introduced in to the dental world. This approach keeps IPDC, always a step ahead in dental education. In this regard, IPDC had

procured state of the art 3-D Scanner DW-IO-100 and 3-D Printer.

Combination of 3D Scanner and 3D Printer provides a giant leap towards Digital Dentistry. Students have shifted their traditional work of Impression making and pouring cast into digitally scanned impressions and printing the cast.

Final year undergraduates learn to use these equipments during their postings in the Department of Orthodontics and Prosthodontics. Our Post-Graduate students use printer to fabricate clear aligners and delivering high quality treatment to the patients.

Students are also taught to read the scans and further transfer the files for 3D printing. Scanning and printing is now an integral part of practice by students and staff to deliver precise treatment in less time.

8.1.2 - The Institution ensures adequate training for students in pre-clinical skills. Describe the steps taken to improve pre-clinical skills along with details of facilities available for students such as pre-clinical skill labs

The scope of preclinical training is to impart pre-clinical skills of dentistry in a simulated environment present in various labs in IPDC which have state-of-the-art equipment. The Prosthodontics preclinical laboratory introduces students to learn how to make complete dentures, removable partial dentures along with manipulation of abundant dental materials. Pre-Clinical Conservative (PCC) and Endodontic laboratory motivates students to apply magnifying dentistry via LOOPS to learn pre-clinical skills on typodonts. Apart from Typodont exercises, the students are taught cavity preparation as well as root canal procedures on natural teeth. PCC Lab showcases video streaming of the pre-clinical exercises on every practising chair.

Orthodontics preclinical laboratory makes students perform all basic wire bending exercises whereas carving of deciduous tooth on wax blocks is practised in Paediatric preclinical laboratory.

Each Department has Post Graduate workstations equipped with Suction, Micro-motor attachments for performing pre-clinical exercises.

Students obtain requisite foundational skills in IPDC's Pre-Clinical skill labs in order to practise dentistry safely and confidently essential for the success of competency-based dental programme.

8.1.8 - The Institution has introduced objective methods to measure and certify attainment of specific clinical competencies by BDS students/interns as stated in the undergraduate curriculum by the Dental Council of India.

IPDC emphasizes the fact that UG/PG students should acquire competent clinical skills and knowledge for appearing in final university examination. IPDC has adopted Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) and Objective Structured Practical Examination (OSPE) for evaluating students' clinical skills which promote interactions with faculty members throughout the assessment and enable immediate and formative input from the examiners.

The OSCE provides a comprehensive overview of the student's knowledge of clinical concepts and their strengths and weakness. Even non clinical departments conduct OSPE, at the very beginning of the undergraduate course, which lays a foundation to acquire clinical skills later.

Students are assigned speciality specific seminar topics, faculty in charge involves the students in every steps of the execution and conceptualization of the topics for presenting a well-structured seminar. IPDC has trained its faculty in the OSCE/OSPE to assess students' clinical skills by 10-point choice based grading system by UGC.

However, the final assessment of the students is still held as per the guidelines by DCI/ Atal Bihari Vajpayee University, Lucknow.
