Interdepartmental Collaboration: Regular meetings are held to discuss integrated treatment plans for complex cases, ensuring the most effective care for patients. Character and Skill Development: Value-Added Programs: IPDC organizes programs such as Women's Day celebrations, World Disability day, Yoga Programs, soft skill and personality development program. Research and Scientific Development: Encouraging Research: The institution emphasizes the importance of research and development, encouraging student participation in research projects. Grants are provided for notable studies, and programs on scientific writing are conducted to improve research output. Alignment with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020: IPDC is committed to providing students with a multidisciplinary learning experience that ensures they acquire clinical, ethical, and professional skills. The institution aims to produce graduates and postgraduates who are well-prepared to practice dentistry independently and contribute meaningfully to society. In summary, IPDC fosters an integrated, multidisciplinary approach to education, ensuring students are equipped with the skills and knowledge required for both clinical practice and professional growth, in alignment with the National Education Policy 2020.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

To align with the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) framework in higher education, our university must first complete enrollment with the ABC system. Notably, our institution has already implemented the 10-point grading system, as recommended by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Dental Council of India (DCI). Recognizing the importance of preparing for the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP), the college has taken proactive steps by registering with the National Academic Depository. Additionally, students are being encouraged to create DigiLocker accounts and upload their certificates to ensure seamless participation in the initiative. Efforts are underway to sensitize students by equipping them with the necessary knowledge and skills to adapt to these changes. Meanwhile, the institution continues to offer a variety of interdisciplinary and add-on courses, promoting flexibility and catering to the diverse interests of students.

17.Skill development:

Skill development in dentistry is essential to ensuring that dental professionals are proficient in both clinical and non-clinical aspects of their practice. This includes technical expertise, patient management, communication skills, and ongoing professional development. At IPDC, students receive comprehensive training that fosters the development of both clinical and communication skills, essential for their future careers.

1. Clinical Skills Development

Diagnosis and Treatment Planning: Department of Oral medicine and Radiology able the students to diagnose a wide range of oral health issues, from routine dental problems to complex pathologies. Skill development includes thorough patient examinations, interpretation of diagnostic tests (such as radiographs), and formulating effective treatment plans.

Hands-on Training: Preclinical simulation labs and clinical practice allow students to develop manual dexterity, precision, and attention to detail when performing procedures. This includes restorative treatments, extractions, root canal treatments, and other dental procedures in the department of conservative and Department of Prosthodontics.

Surgical Skills: In departments like Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery, students gain practical experience in minor and major surgical procedures. Training includes hands-on surgeries, suturing techniques, and post-operative care.

Periodontal and Implant Training: In Periodontology & Implantology, students develop skills in diagnosing periodontal diseases, performing scaling and root planing, and using advanced implant techniques for both therapeutic and cosmetic purposes.

2. Technological Skills

Radiographic and Imaging Skills: In Oral Medicine & Radiology, students gain expertise in various radiographic techniques, including digital radiography, and panoramic imaging. These skills are crucial for accurate diagnosis and treatment planning.

Advanced Equipment Handling: Students in departments like Conservative Dentistry and Prosthodontics work with state-of-the-art dental equipment, including 3D scanners, for crowns and bridges, and laser dentistry. Mastery of such technologies improves both the quality of care and efficiency in practice.

Implantology: In Prosthodontics and Implantology, students develop skills in placing and restoring dental implants, using advanced implant systems, and understanding the biomechanics of implants for optimal patient outcomes.

3. Patient Management and Communication

Effective Communication: A key part of skill development is learning how to communicate effectively with patients. This includes explaining treatment options, managing patient anxieties, and providing post-treatment care instructions.

Soft Skills and Empathy: Developing soft skills such as empathy, professionalism, and active listening is essential for building trust with patients and managing diverse patient needs. Training often includes role-playing scenarios, patient interaction simulations, and workshops in communication skills.

Cultural Competency: With India's vast cultural diversity, training in cultural sensitivity is crucial. Students learn how to communicate and manage patients from different cultural, linguistic, and socio-economic backgrounds.

4. Preventive Care and Health Promotion

Oral Health Education: Students in departments like Public Health Dentistry and Pediatric Dentistry are trained to educate patients and communities on preventive care, including proper brushing techniques, the importance of diet, and the prevention of oral diseases.

Preventive Procedures: Students learn how to perform preventive procedures such as fluoride treatments, sealants, and basic orthodontic care in

Pediatric and Preventive Dentistry. They also assess and manage caries risk, especially in children and at-risk populations. 5. Research and Evidence-Based Practice Research Skills: Dentists must be able to critically assess the latest research and incorporate evidence-based practices into their treatment approaches. Students are encouraged to participate in research projects, develop skills in literature reviews, and contribute to publications in dental journals. This sharpens their decision-making skills for clinical practice. 6. Ethical and Professional Development Ethical Decision-Making: Dentistry requires strong ethical guidelines. Students learn about patient confidentiality, informed consent, and professional responsibility. They are trained to handle ethical dilemmas in patient care and professional conduct. Leadership and Teamwork: In clinical settings and community outreach programs, students are encouraged to work collaboratively with faculty, fellow students, and other healthcare professionals. This helps develop leadership, teamwork, and management skills that are vital for running a successful practice. 7. Specialized Skill Training Orthodontic and Dentofacial Orthopedic Techniques: In Orthodontics, students gain expertise in various treatment modalities for malocclusions, including fixed appliances, space maintainers, and clear aligners. They also learn to assess and address facial growth patterns and alignments. Prosthodontic Restoration Skills: In Prosthodontics and Crown & Bridge, students learn to restore missing teeth and manage facial defects using crowns, bridges, dentures, and other prostheses. This includes learning about the aesthetic and functional aspects of restorations. Endodontic Skills: In Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics, students develop expertise in performing root canal treatments, managing endodontic complications, and mastering the use of modern technologies like rotary instruments and apex locators. 8. Hands-on and Field Experience Clinical Exposure: Real-world clinical exposure, including internships, field visits, and dental camps, is integral for hands-on experience. Students in Public Health Dentistry and other departments are encouraged to participate in dental outreach programs in rural and semi-urban areas, where they gain practical experience in diagnosing and treating a wide range of oral health conditions. 9. This holistic approach prepares the students to excel in clinical practice while also enhancing their ability to build strong, empathetic relationships with patients, setting them up for success in their professional lives.

These include dental camps, school health education, and dental awareness programs in semi-urban and rural areas. By encouraging students to communicate in regional languages, the institution ensures accessibility and cultural sensitivity, reinforcing the importance of language in bridging gaps and fostering effective patient care. In addition, the institution conducts programs such as gender sensitization and environmental awareness, promoting a sense of social responsibility and drawing from the ethical and community-focused values rooted in Indian traditions. Incorporating the Indian Knowledge System further, the institution integrates holistic wellness practices into the curriculum, including programs on yoga, diet, and lifestyle, to foster the overall development of students. These programs are inspired by traditional Indian practices, underscoring the significance of mind-body harmony in maintaining health—a core tenet of IKS. Cultural engagement plays a key role in student development, with the institution (IPDC) organizing annual celebrations of Indian festivals and national days, such as Teachers' Day, Doctors' Day, Women's Day, Oral Hygiene Day, Diwali, Christmas, Dussehra, and Holi. Sustainable dentistry is another area where Indian traditions are deeply aligned with modern practices. The concept of sustainability, which is integral to many aspects of Indian culture, is reflected in the institution's focus on eco-friendly dental practices. For example, the use of biodegradable products like bamboo toothbrushes. Thus integrating the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) into dental education blends traditional wisdom with modern practices, ensuring a culturally relevant

and socially responsible curriculum. This approach prepares dental professionals to provide inclusive, sustainable care, bridging India's rich heritage with contemporary healthcare needs.

Both the BDS and MDS curricula follow an outcome-based education model, placing equal emphasis on clinical proficiency, research understanding, and leadership development. Clearly defined program outcomes and course objectives foster an intellectually stimulating environment that drives student growth and transformation. To ensure continuous progress, students undergo regular evaluations that include theoretical and practical assessments, vivas, and ongoing monitoring. The results are carefully analyzed through a structured protocol, categorizing students as slow or advanced learners. For those who require additional support, remedial classes, assignments, and a mentor-mentee system are in place to guide slow learners, enabling them to achieve noticeable improvements in subsequent evaluations. Furthermore, students participating in value-added and add-on programs are assessed using outcome-based feedback, which helps gauge their understanding and the effectiveness of these supplementary learning experiences. Outcome-Based Competencies achieved by the students as Clinical Competencies: The ability to perform dental procedures such as fillings, crowns, extractions, and root canals competently, with a focus on patient safety, infection control, and treatment planning. Communication Skills: Effective communication with patients, their families, and the healthcare team, including obtaining informed consent and educating patients about oral health. Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving: Ability to assess patient conditions, diagnose dental issues, and make evidence-based treatment decisions. Professionalism and Ethics: Understanding and adhering to ethical guidelines, maintaining professionalism in patient interactions, and demonstrating responsibility and accountability. IPDC is unwavering in its commitment to excellence and professionalism, making research an integral part of patient-centered practice. The institution ensures that all departments meticulously define and maintain program outcomes, with well-documented course files for both BDS and MDS programs, reinforcing the institution's dedication to high educational standards and continuous professional development.

20.Distance education/online education:

IPDC is dedicated to leveraging digital technologies to enhance the student learning experience. Recognizing the need for adaptability, the institution offers transition to online learning to ensure the continuity of education. 1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning, delivery and evaluation through a well defined process as prescribed by the respective regulatory councils and the affiliating University.

The BDS & MDS Curriculum at Inderprastha Dental College & Hospital (IPDC) adheres to DCI guidelines. Formerly affiliated with Chaudhary Charan Singh University, IPDC is now under Atal Bihari Vajpayee University. The academic delivery aligns with the affiliating university's regulations.

While maintaining this alignment, IPDC distinguishes itself by offering valuable additions to enrich students' professional and personal lives. Regularly organized value-added courses, seminars(CPC), CDEs, and workshops, led by subject matter experts, contribute to this enrichment.

The Institution/Academic Committee formulates an academic calendar integrating lectures, labs, and clinical postings. The Principal and Heads of Departments collaborate on curriculum delivery methods, incorporating feedback from faculties, students, alumni & professionals. The recommendations are discussed, evaluated, and considered for implementation.

Evaluation follows University norms, with students facing three internal assessment exams annually. IPDC closely monitors student progress, conveying updates to parents. Remedial classes for identified slow learners aim to enhance their performance.

2.5.1 - The Institution adheres to the academic calendar for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation and ensures that it is robust and transparent

At the beginning of each academic year, the Head of Institution (HOI) alongwith the Academic Committee to develop the institution's academic calendar. This calendar adheres to the recommendations set forth by the Dental Council of India for both undergraduate and postgraduate programs, and the teaching schedule is established at the start of the session.

Academic Calendar

- **Comprehensive Overview:** The calendar provides detailed information about internal assessment dates and schedules.

First-year postgraduate students attend basic science lectures, while all postgraduate students preparing for exams participate in mock tests prior to university examinations.

Facilities for Clinical Teaching and Learning:

The outpatient, inpatient and surgical facilities are undertaken at IPDC & Hospital and MMG Hospital, a 200 bedded government hospital, well-equipped with modern amenities. In the dental departments students treat patients under the supervision of faculty, with one to one interaction between them. Laboratory work for the clinical procedures are done in Ceramic, Acrylic and Casting Labs. Our highly qualified faculty ensures quality education in dental and medical subjects. Emphasizing community learning, IPDC regularly conducts outreach camps in diverse areas.

Clinical Teaching and Laboratory Facilities

At IPDC, clinical teaching takes place in every dental department with outpatient wards and MMG hospital (200 bedded) where interns and students can carry out therapeutic procedures. A seminar hall for presentations, a pre-clinical lab for exercises and biochemical analyses, and a research lab furnished for research projects are among the resources that are offered to undergraduate and graduate students.

With an average of 12,536 patients every month, the facility offers students plenty of learning opportunities for clinical dental treatments. There are also dedicated spaces for specialized clinics, such as a tobacco cessation centre, geriatric clinic, implant clinic, and aesthetics clinic.

1. **Basic Equipment:** IPDC's facilities are furnished with mannequins, models, and handpieces for basic exercises in pre-clinical labs. Equipment in the clinical lab area includes induction casting machines, burnout furnaces, micromotors, metal grinders, sandblasters, duplicators, vacuum investors, ceramic and metal finishing kits, microtomes, and tissue processing unit.

2. **Advanced Dental Equipment:** IPDC also has specialized dental tools, such as research microscope, aligners, Nemoceph, intraoral scanner, dental laser, and implant physiodispenser. Conscious Sedation Machine and Dental Operating Microscope are new additions.

Every facility satisfies the standards established by the Dental Council of India (DCI).

This comprehensive assortment is systematically organized into various sections.

Collection and Resources

The library is updated annually based on the curriculum and budget, ensuring coverage of all dental specialties and fundamental medical sciences. Currently, the library holds:

- Books: 2,774 print books and 850 eBooks across various subjects.
- Journals: 5224 print journals (covering 91 titles) and 940 e-journals across dental and related fields for reference and study.
- Multimedia: 153 audio-visual CDs to support learning through multimedia.

Digital Access and Specialized Subscriptions

IPDC subscribes to EBSCO, a specialized database providing students access to discipline-specific resources such as journal articles and research reports essential for thesis work and other research projects. Access to EBSCO is available via institutional login and IP authentication, which includes 850 eBooks and 940 e-journals focused on dental sciences.

IPDC has an effective Performance Appraisal System. The performance of each employee is assessed annually after completion of one year of service. Faculty member whose promotion are due are recommended based on their performance activities besides academics, for which academic faculty member is assessed and verified by the Heads of the Departments followed by the Head of the Institute and secretary IPDC.

Staff Member (Teaching Staff)

Appraisal for teaching staff is done after performance evaluation on yearly basis and is up to INR 5000.

Staff Member (Non-Teaching Staff)

The performance of the non-teaching staff of the department is appraised by the Head of the respective departments. They are evaluated by the supervisor based on behaviour, discipline, efficiency, cordiality and overall department work abilities.

Resource allocation involves the planning of all the resources required for accomplishing vision and mission of the institute. IPDC has a completely digitalized accounts department which manages accounts efficiently and effectively. We have a two-tier audit system which conducts periodic evaluations. Student tuition fee is the main source of income generation for the institution. The tuition fee is fixed on the rules and regulations of the Medical Education, Government of Uttar Pradesh.

24% of the revenue generated was spent for the salary of teaching and non-teaching staff. Around 0.9% of the total revenue was spent for the library. Major portion of the revenue generated, around 59% was utilized for infrastructure development. 8% was used for equipments for the lab. 5% was spent on the purchase of consumables. 4% was used in the repair and maintenance in the institution. Part of it was spent on the e-governance, intramural and funding for research projects, reimbursing the conferences, courses, seminars registration fee for teaching staff. Around 0.4% was used for Faculty development and training, 0.1% for Continuing Dental Education Programmes in the academic year 2023-2024.

BEST PRACTICE-2 Quit Tobacco- A Mission of IPDC

IPDC has been conducting Industrial Camps for years and observed that industrial workers were committed to tobacco use, thus IPDC committed itself to get these workers quit the habit.

Hence, industries are identified, where all workers are screened and tobacco users are identified. Thereafter, tobacco cessation habit counselling is done.

In year 2023 IPDC signed MOU with Ahluwalia Contracts India Ltd. and Jain Enterprises where with IPDC efforts 80 % and 78 % Tobacco users respectively quit use of tobacco.

In year 2024 MOU were signed between IPDC with Allana Industry and RSPL industry. All Tobacco users were identified and are under regular follow up to quit tobacco use habit.

Students are also taught to read the scans and further transfer the files for 3D printing. Scanning and printing is now an integral part of practice by students and staff to deliver precise treatment in less time.

The aim of preclinical training at IPDC is to equip students with foundational dental skills in a simulated lab environment using advanced equipment. In the Prosthodontics lab, students learn to create complete and partial dentures while handling a variety of dental materials. The Pre-Clinical Conservative (PCC) and Endodontic lab encourages students to practice magnifying techniques through dental loupes, enabling them to perform preclinical procedures on typodonts. In addition to typodont exercises, students learn vital skills in cavity preparation and root canal treatments on natural teeth, with instructional videos available at each workstation to enhance their learning.

The Orthodontics lab teaches students essential wire-bending techniques, while the Pediatric lab focuses on carving deciduous teeth on wax blocks, helping to sharpen their understanding of pediatric dental anatomy. Each department features postgraduate workstations equipped with suction systems and micro-motor attachments, providing hands-on experience in preclinical tasks.

These comprehensive preclinical labs allow students to develop essential skills in a controlled, practice-focused setting, building the confidence and competence necessary to perform dental procedures safely. IPDC's preclinical training prepares students thoroughly for real-world practice, contributing significantly to the success of a competency-based dental program and ensuring they meet high standards in dental care delivery.

To enhance skill acquisition and evaluation, IPDC has implemented Objective Structured Clinical Examinations (OSCE) and Objective Structured Practical Examinations (OSPE) for assessing students' clinical competencies. These methods foster interactive assessments, allowing faculty to provide immediate, formative feedback that helps students recognize their strengths and areas for improvement.

The OSCE offers a comprehensive assessment of clinical concepts and practical skills, while OSPE is employed by non-clinical departments at the start of the undergraduate program to help students build a foundation for later clinical skill development. Additionally, students are given specialty-specific seminar topics

Faculty at IPDC is trained in OSCE and OSPE methods to evaluate clinical skills effectively, utilizing a UGC-approved 10-point choice-based grading system.

While IPDC uses these innovative assessment tools for continuous learning and skill development, final assessments remain under the guidelines set by the Dental Council of India (DCI) and Atal Bihari Vajpayee University in Lucknow. This approach ensures that IPDC students are well-prepared and confident in their clinical abilities, aligning with both educational innovation and regulatory standards.
