GENERAL REGULATIONS, ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLMENT

1. The two parties agree to enter into a student exchange agreement, commencing from the academic year 2021-2022.
2. The participating PG students will be registered at their parent institution for the full academic year.
3. Each institution may send up to 05 students based on HOD recommendations per academic year to participate in the exchange program. Either of the institutions may send a student after one full academic year. The number of participants may be increased subject to the mutual agreement of both Institutions.
4. It is expected that in any given year there will be an equal number of students exchanged from each institution.
5. Notwithstanding Clauses 3 and 4 above, while equal numbers in every year may not be possible, efforts will be made to have equal numbers exchanged.
6. The candidates will be PG students who are completing a program at their respective institutions.
7. The candidates will be selected by their respective institutions to participate in the exchange, and will then be considered for admission as non-degree special students by the host institutions. Candidates must satisfy admission requirements for special student status, which will be mutually decided by both the Institutions, of the host institution and the host department.

8. Participants in the exchange will be required to have completed at least one year of full-time affiliating university studies prior to participation in the exchange. Participating post-graduate students should have completed at least one year of study at the home institution.
9. The participants will visit the host institution for a minimum of 06 days in one academic year.
10. Each institution will appoint an individual faculty to act as the coordinator for the exchange.
11. The host institutions will have the right of denial of any candidate who may appear to be unacceptable for the exchange. Each sending institution will follow the exchange application deadlines set by the receiving institution.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS/IMPLICATIONS

12. The participants in the exchange will bear the cost of boarding and travelling.
13. The host institution will provide the appropriate facilities necessary to support the exchange and will also cover the cost of food for the participating students.

RESOURCES AND REGULATIONS AT THE HOST INSTITUTION

14. Students from the participating institution will be encouraged to gain academic knowledge from faculty members and students of the host institution and will be able to promote and explore more research areas in their respective field of specialization.
15. At the end of the exchange period, the participants in the exchange will request the host institution to send to the home institution a report/official transcript of their academic achievement.

The dismissal of a participant shall not abrogate the agreement for the arrangements regarding other participants.

B. This memorandum sets out the initial relationship between the Parties as well as the respective rights and responsibilities of each Party.


