AND

AR Service GmbH, Head office located at Bahnhofstrasse 13, 31303 Burgdorf, Germany, represented through Ms. Sabrina Lid, hereinafter referred to as the "HOSPITAL".

That the COLLEGE is running Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) and Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) course at its premises, training students to become Dentists, and the same is recognised by Government of India.

That the HOSPITAL is running a NURSING HOSPITAL offering Dental Services, offering dental diagnostic and dental clinical services to patients.


That the AGREEMENT is witnessed here as follows: -

1. The HOSPITAL will allow students undergoing Internship in the said COLLEGE after completion of their BDS course, to visit and complete Clinical Observership, for a period of one month in the said HOSPITAL under the guidance of an authorised Dentist.
2. That the COLLEGE will identify students interested in the Clinical Observership. And send at any one time maximum of 3 students to undergo Clinical Observership.
3. The students will bear the cost of flight tickets, visa, and accommodation during the program.
4. The HOSPITAL will help arrange local accommodation, local travel and food, during the program. The cost of the same shall be borne by students directly.
5. The students shall visit the HOSPITAL daily, to observe different Clinical cases, take medical history of the patients, they shall be able to observe different diagnostic and Clinical procedures, and sterilisation protocols.

6. The HOSPITAL will arrange a Dentist as a guide / trainer to the students, who shall be fluent in English language, who shall help the students understand the different procedures and protocols.
7. Weekly off shall be on Saturday, Sunday for students to experience the local German culture. The students shall be free to do as they please, during the weekends.
8. This program can be run maximum of 2 times in a year. The dates shall be finalised with mutual agreement of the COLLEGE and the HOSPITAL.
9. This program does not certify the students to practise Dentistry in Germany and is only meant as an additional learning experience to their practise in India.

Any dispute shall be subject to jurisdiction of Court in Hildesheim, Germany.



Women Forum and Athena women forum.**



- TADs, Application of early elastics.
- Repositioning of bite turbo.
- Check the effectiveness of the system and if needed modify treatment strategies.

Module 4-

- Diagnosis and treatment planning in moderate to severe malocclusion cases and to discuss the utility of variable torque brackets in such cases.
- Management of Class II malocclusion cases with Damon system
- Placement of anterior bite turbo in class II cases
- Application of early elastics.
- Biomechanics & Anchorage considerations in class II malocclusions.
- Live demonstration on couple of full case to be started by the course director with Damon System.

Note: Orthodontic treatment is a long-drawn process, and one has to be a keen observer to be able to read the changes taking place in position of teeth in response to the orthodontic appliance. The response to the appliance may vary from patient to patient. To have a cookbook approach would be difficult but following standard procedural protocols would be sensible.
